## B.Sc. Course in Electronic Engineering of Newport University - USA

As the Chief External Examiner of the degree course in Electronic Engineering offered by City Tutorial College, I am able to confirm that the course may be recongnised as equivalent in level and content to an ordinary B.Sc. Course of a British University.

Incorporated in the degree programme is a final year laboratory course provided by the City University. All the experiments on this course are selected from those used in Parts II and III of the B.Sc. Honours Degree Course in Electronic Engineering offered to its own students by the City University. Dear Dr. Werres:

This is in answer to your letter requesting information on the legal use of earned degrees in Oregon.

A degree awarded by an institution legally approved to award degrees in California is generally recognized in Oregon. However, professional degrees in areas such as medicine, psychology, law, and architecture are not sufficient in themselves to permit the practicing of those professions in Oregon without first passing a state examination. Also, One cannot represent themselves to the public as having the authority to practice a particular profession in the State without passing the examination.
